SECTION 1 - STATEMENT OF WORK for Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility (DEIA) Consultant

Project Title: In-Person Mitigating Unconscious Bias Training at Embassy Nouakchott

Purpose: Design two in-person training sessions to reinforce the online course PT144 Mitigating Unconscious Bias for Embassy Nouakchott desk employees and introduce the topic to non-desk employees. Train four to six Locally Engaged (LE) Staff to facilitate the sessions. Support LES in delivering 20 two-hour sessions for Embassy staff.

Objectives:

- Enhance training participant understanding of unconscious bias
- Increase training participants ability to recognize unconscious bias in the workplace
- Training participants identify of how they can mitigate unconscious bias in their work

Tasks:

Kick-off: The Consultant will complete an in-brief with the Embassy Nouakchott Human Resources Officer to review the SOW and receive access to required materials and points of contact, including the names and contact information of the four to six identified LE Staff trainers. The Consultant will gather additional information on the Embassy's training needs and opportunities for success.

Design: The Consultant will review the Department of State (DoS) PT144 Mitigating Unconscious Bias course. Based on the content of this course, the Consultant will develop three training plans and related materials:

- 1. A two-hour training session for Embassy Nouakchott desk employees who have taken the PT144 Mitigating Unconscious Bias course
- 2. A two-hour training session for Embassy Nouakchott non-desk employees who have not previously taken a mitigating unconscious bias course
- 3. A two-day training for LES trainers to include effective training methods for adults, facilitation best practices, the content of the two training designs, and a workshop for practicing and improving the delivery of the two training sessions

Each of the training plans should define the purpose and objectives of the training, delivery methods, a proposed schedule, slides, other visual aids, and how learning will be measured.

Training of Trainers: The training of trainers will take place in an Embassy Nouakchott conference room over two workdays during normally scheduled work hours.

Training Facilitation and Trainer Support: The Consultant will support the trainers in delivering 20 two-hour training sessions to Embassy employees. The Consultant may choose to lead the facilitation of the initial training sessions as part of the capacity development of the trainers and then transition the facilitation responsibilities to the LE Staff trainers. The training of

trainers will take place in an Embassy Nouakchott conference room over two workdays during normally scheduled work hours.

The session materials should be presented in local languages, such as French and/or Arabic, in addition to English. The LE Staff trainers will be responsible for translating the slides, visual aids, and any materials that will be distributed during the training. Some sessions for desk employees may be delivered in English, while non-desk employee sessions should prioritize local languages.

Evaluation: The Consultant will gather data that measures participant learning in each of the three trainings (trainer of trainers, desk employees, non-desk employees) and present finding and recommendations for future sessions to the Human Resources Officer.

Three training plans and materials

Participant attendance sheets from all training sessions

Evaluation report

The project will be completed in April and/or May 2023. Exact dates will be coordinated with the Human Resources Officer.

Budget and Payment Schedule

The Consultant's proposal budget should include no more than 15 days level of effort for the project.

Payment will be made upon acceptance of all deliverables by the Human Resources Officer.

- (9) Work in confined spaces (limited exits, potential for oxygen less than 19.5 percent or combustible atmosphere, potential for solid or liquid engulfment, or other hazards considered to be immediately dangerous to life or health such as water tanks, transformer vaults, sewers, cisterns, etc.);
- (10) Hazardous materials a material with a physical or health hazard including but not limited to, flammable, explosive, corrosive, toxic, reactive or unstable, or any operations, which creates any kind of contamination inside an occupied building such as dust from demolition activities, paints, solvents, etc.; or
- (11) Hazardous noise levels as required in EM 385-1 Section 5B or local standards if more restrictive.
- (b) Safety and Health Requirements. The contractor and all subcontractors shall comply with the latest edition of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health manual EM 385-1-1, or OSHA 29 CFR parts 1910 or 1926 if no EM 385-1-1 requirements are applicable, and the accepted contractor's written safety program.
- (c) Mishap Reporting. The contractor is required to report immediately all mishaps to the COR and the contracting officer. A "mishap" is any event causing injury, disease or illness, death, material loss or property damage, or incident causing environmental contamination. The mishap reporting requirement shall include fires, explosions, hazardous materials contamination, and other similar incidents that may threaten people, property, and equipment.
- (d) Records. The contractor shall maintain an accurate record on all mishaps incident to work performed under this contract resulting in death, traumatic injury, occupational disease, or damage to or theft of property, materials, supplies, or equipment. The contractor shall report this data in the manner prescribed by the contracting officer.

- (e) Subcontracts. The contractor shall insert this clause, including this paragraph (e), with appropriate changes in the designation of the parties, in subcontracts.
- (f) Written program. The plan required by paragraph (f)(1) of the clause entitled "Accident Prevention Alternate I" shall be known as the Site Safety and Health Plan (SSHP) and shall address any activities listed in paragraph (a) of this clause, or as otherwise required by the contracting officer/COR.

The SSHP shall be submitted at least 10 working days prior to commencing any activity at the site.

The plan must address developing activity hazard analyses (AHAs) for specific tasks. The AHAs shall define the activities being performed and identify the work sequences, the specific anticipated hazards, site conditions, equipment, materials, and the control measures to be implemented to eliminate or reduce each hazard to an acceptable level of risk. Work shall not begin until the AHA for the work activity has been accepted by the COR and discussed with all engaged in the activity, including the Contractor, subcontractor(s), and Government on-site representatives.

(3) The names of the Competent/Qualified Person(s) required for a particular activity (for example, excavations, scaffolding, fall protection, other activities as specified by EM 385-1-1) shall be identified and included in the AHA. Proof of their competency/qualification shall be submitted to the contracting officer or COR for acceptance prior to the start of that work activity. The AHA shall be reviewed and modified as necessary to address changing site conditions, operations, or change of competent/qualified person(s). (End of clause)

652.242-73 AUTHORIZATION AND PERFORMANCE (AUG 1999)

- (a) The Contractor warrants the following:
 - (1) That is has obtained authorization to operate and do business in the country or countries in which this contract will be performed;
 - (2) That is has obtained all necessary licenses and permits required to perform this contract; and,
 - (3) That it shall comply fully with all laws, decrees, labor standards, and regulations of said country or countries during the performance of this contract.
- (b) If the party actually performing the work will be a subcontractor or joint venture partner, then such subcontractor or joint venture partner agrees to the requirements of paragraph (a) of this clause.
